

Each local commercial station in the UK has obligations with regard to its programmes, including its music and local content. These obligations are set out in the station Format which forms part of this station's Public File.

The Public File is also available in hard copy by post upon request by any member of the public, and serves as one indicator of each station's output. Comment on the contents of the Public File should be made to the station or to the industry regulator, Ofcom.

What we deliver....

Radio Ceredigion broadcasts international news every hour with the exception of Sundays at 1600, 1700 and 1800.

Radio Ceredigion broadcasts the News for Wales bulletin weekdays from 6am to 6pm inclusive which is a bespoke bulletin of International and Wales news compiled and delivered from Nation Broadcasting Group's (NBG) newsteam at St Hilary.

In addition to the News for Wales bulletin, Radio Ceredigion broadcasts dedicated local news bulletins at the following times:

5pm & 5.30pm

We regularly offer work experience placements within the news team.

The news team is further supplemented by members of management and administrative who are also able to collect content as appropriate.

The average number of hours of automated programming within weekday daytimes and within daytimes on Saturdays and Sundays

At Radio Ceredigion we make full use of broadcast playout technology in order to deliver our programmes and free up presentation staff to produce local content.

All programming is automated overnight (7pm – 6am)

The overwhelming majority of our daytime programming is presented live or recorded on the day of transmission however certain elements of it would also be considered automated under the definition published by Ofcom.

The amount of local programming per day produced by the station

With the exception of the Hit 40 UK Chart (Sun 1600-1900) all programming on Radio Carmarthenshire is delivered locally from one of Nation Broadcasting's two broadcast centres.

The broadcast centres are located within the licensed area of Pembrokeshire and Bridgend and Radio Ceredigion is permitted to locate in either of these areas (and some others).

Certain Welsh language content is delivered remotely from contributors based within the West Wales approved area.

Shared programming and content

Radio Ceredigion is permitted to share programming and content with its sister West Wales Stations: Radio Pembrokeshire and Radio Carmarthenshire and Scarlet FM.

All content on Radio Ceredigion is shared with Radio Carmarthenshire and Scarlet FM.

Content is also shared with Radio Pembrokeshire at various times including:

Overnight from 9pm to 6am,
Weekday daytime and drivetime 1pm-7pm,
Weekend programming except Sunday 6-8am and 7-8pm

The Rugby Nation show (Wednesday 7pm-8pm) is shared across the Nation Radio group.

Although the programming is shared under Ofcom's definition; there is a considerable amount of market specific programming broadcast during shared programming. This includes:-

- Local news specific to the county
- Local events specific to the county
- Various programming links and interviews which are station specific
- Branding and advertising specific to the county

We also retain the ability for stations to standalone should there be an editorial reason to do so (for example a station specific event broadcast).
